Tennessee Technology Center Awarded \$1.2M in Grant Funds

The Tennessee Technology Center at Pulaski is the recipient of 1.2 million dollars through the availability of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act. The stimulus dollars will allow TTCP to provide new training programs for dislocated workers and students looking for new and better careers. New programs for Lawrence County include two additional Practical Nursing programs and a Business Systems Technology program. In addition, TTCP has received \$124,000 to start a Residential Building Trades program at Summertown High School in partnership with the Lawrence County School System. A grant of \$200,000 was awarded to develop a new high-tech program in Solar Photovoltaic Technology. Jobs for solar technicians and installers should grow tremendously over the next few years as more practical and economical ways to use solar power continue to evolve with Green Energy systems.
